2015 Budget Adopted

No Real Estate Tax Increase

Your Township Budget has been approved by the Board of Supervisors without a real estate tax increase. The General Fund budget includes revenues of \$9,555,653 a 2% increase over 2014; and, expenses of \$9,815,661, a 1.9% increase over 2014. The budget will use \$260,008 in excess fund balance reserves as well as \$242,622 transferred from Sewer Fund income generated through the hauled-in waste program. The total tax rate will remain at 2.87 mil which equates to \$287 on a property assessed at \$100,000. The breakdown of your township tax rate is as follows: 1.815 mil for general purposes (police, public works, parks & recreation, building, zoning & code enforcement, library and administration); .555 mil for fire services and .50 mil for debt service. The total Township Budget for 2015 (all funds) includes revenues of \$19,894,533 and expenses of \$22,104,093. The sources and uses of these funds are depicted in the charts found on page 2.

The Board and staff have many challenges ahead in managing the Township. With an eye towards increased revenue, the Board will be considering initiatives to promote economic development within the Township and may consider alternative governmental structure in order to have more flexibility with taxing structure. They may also enter into talks with neighboring municipalities to discuss the possibility of intergovernmental cooperation. Your input and participation is always welcome!

Let It Snow... Let It Snow... Let It Snow...

As the snow falls this year, remember that, as property owners, you are required, by ordinance, to keep 3 feet of sidewalk clear of snow for pedestrians and **also 3 feet around fire hydrants.** Note that it is unlawful to deposit the snow or ice onto public streets.



As usual, Exeter's highway crews will be ready to clear the streets. Since plows push snow to the sides of the streets and can block the entrance to driveways, residents are advised to wait to clear the end of their driveways and walkways until after the plow has cleared their street. Residents living on **cul-de-sacs** will have to wait longer to have their section of the road cleared because often they require loaders and smaller trucks for clearing and there are only three loaders available for this purpose and we have **85 cul-de-sacs!**

Residents are asked to please be patient as the crews will work as fast as they can.

Mailbox Replacement Policy

Unfortunately, during snow storms, sometimes mailboxes and mailbox posts become victims of the snow thrown from snow plows.

In order to be fair, the Township developed a policy for the replacement of damaged items.

The Township will replace a damaged mailbox and post with a standard mailbox and post, or will pay the homeowner \$15 to replace a damaged mailbox and/or \$20 to replace a pressure treated post for a total of \$35 if both are damaged. Installation of the replacement mailbox and post will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Residents with damage can purchase the items and bring the bill to the Township for reimbursement or can request a new mailbox and/or post by calling (610) 779-5660.



PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WINTER

BEFORE COLD WEATHER SETS IN:



Check sprinkler or irrigation systems

Make sure you've turned everything off and fully drained the system.



Identify your home's freezing points

Check your home for pipes in areas that might be prone to freezing, such as crawl spaces, unheated rooms, basements, garages, and exterior walls.



Know how to shut off your water

Locate your main water shut-off valve. Hang the I.D. tag located on the back of this insert on the valve, so you can find it quickly in an emergency.



Strengthen your defenses

Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines by closing off crawl spaces, fixing drafty windows, insulating walls and attics, and plugging drafts around doors.



Protect your pipes

Where pipes are exposed to cold, wrap them with insulation or heat tape (even fabric or newspaper can help).

WHEN TEMPERATURES STAY BELOW FREEZING:



Give pipes a helping hand

If pipes run through cabinets or vanities, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.



Keep water working

Keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run. The cost of the extra water is typically lower than the cost of repairing a broken pipe.

BUT IF YOUR PIPES DO FREEZE:



Shut off the water immediately

Don't attempt to thaw pipes without turning off the main shut-off valve.



Thaw pipes with warm air

You can melt the frozen water in the pipe by warming the air around it with a hair dryer or space heater. Be sure not to leave space heaters unattended and avoid the use of kerosene heaters or open flames.



Be careful turning water back on

Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks or leaks that might have been caused by freezing.

AVOID COSTLY REPAIRS: If the meter freezes, the homeowner/business is responsible for the cost to replace or repair the meter. With a little attention, you can help prevent pipes and meters from freezing in your home. The cost to replace a meter is based on the size of the meter. A 3/8" meter is \$130 to replace, a 3/4" meter is \$150 and a 1" meter is \$180.



Exeter Detective Wins Law Enforcement Award

On October 1st, 2014 *Crime Alert Berks County* held an awards banquet to honor individuals who have proven to be vital in the success of the organization. Exeter's **Detective Michael Godshall** won the *Law Enforcement Award* for his contributions.

For the past few years, Detective Godshall has volunteered to be the *Crime Alert Berks Coordinator* to oversee the submissions of "Crime of the Week" that appears in the *Reading Eagle* and *WFMZ Channel 69 News*.

Detective Godshall coordinates with all of Berks County Law Enforcement to obtain special crimes in various municipalities that may need extra media attention. He sorts through the various submissions from law enforcement, reviews the information and completes the article report that is then forwarded to the media. The "Crime of the Week" submissions have led to numerous "tips" being called into Crime Alert that resulted in arrests for various crimes that have been committed throughout Berks County. To date, Crime Alert is responsible for receiving tips that led to **581 arrests** and have paid out \$375,324 to Tipsters.
